ABSTRACT

Costa Rica's *Pago de Servicios Ambientales* (PSA) program is an example of a "payments for ecosystem services" program, which compensates landowners for activities such as protecting forests. Its effects on forest protection in Costa Rica are the subject of this dissertation. Non-PSA points and PSA protection contracts across the country were examined against a global dataset of gross forest cover loss, to estimate avoided deforestation and PSA performance. Then, Google Earth imagery was used to examine forest condition in detail for a PSA contract and two non-PSA points, to demonstrate the use of this resource in aiding the above analysis.
