1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:02 PM.

2. Announcements:

2.1 Accolades:

- 2.1.1 Faculty Hires: Approximately 20 faculty members have been hired.
- 2.1.2 Promotions: Around 10 faculty members received promotions.
- 2.1.3 Reappointments, Promotions, and Tenure (RPT): At least 48 faculty members are undergoing the RPT process this year.

2.2 New Faculty Roles and Leadership for the Academic Year:

- 2.2.1 Several new individuals in leadership posts for the coming academic year across the college, from deans to chairs.

2.4 New University Policies:

- 2.4.1 Academic Standards: A new honor code has been introduced. Training on the new code will be deployed within a month and will be mandatory by January. Clear sanctions have been outlined in the updated code.
- 2.4.2 Required Syllabus Structure/Addendum: Faculty are required to distribute the updated syllabus structure/addendum on the first day of class.

- 3.1 Workload: Taking concrete steps to move towards a standard 2-1 teaching load for tenure stream/tenured faculty that are research active
- 3.2 Evaluation: New faculty assessment procedures were implemented last year. COS leadership will collaborate with Deans to evaluate the effectiveness of these changes.
- 3.3 Dean's Hire: A committee for the Dean's hiring process has been assembled by the Provost. An official announcement will be made in the coming week. The committee's first meeting is scheduled for the week of September 16.
- 3.4 Communication to Faculty: Leadership aims to minimize the number of emails while ensuring faculty receive all necessary information. More concise communication methods are being explored.

4. Deans' Remarks

4.1 Cody Edwards (Interim Dean, 2023-2024)

- 4.1.1 Commitment to transparent processes within the Dean's Office, particularly regarding budgeting. Future meetings will discuss this year's budget in detail. A budget town hall (including faculty, students, and staff) will also be held.
- 4.1.2 COS enrollment is higher compared to other colleges, reflecting positive growth.
- 4.1.3 Will be seeking a replacement for Mary Crowe of the STEM Accelerator, hoping to launch search in October. Rebecca Jones will lead Stem Accelerator in interim.

4.2 Jason Kinser (Associate Dean for Academic Affairs)

- 4.2.1 Open-door policy for faculty support and engagement.
- 4.2.2 The Continuity Working Group (a Provost-level initiative) notes will now be made available on the intranet. Strategic plans and goals will be implemented, with some initiatives beginning immediately.
- 4.2.3 Three working groups are being formed for academic year-long positions:
 - 4.2.3.1 Emerging Pedagogies
 - 4.2.3.2 merging Sciences (future-focused degrees)
 - 4.2.3.3 AI in the Classroom (guidance for instructors and practical use)

- 4.3.1 Open-door policy to support faculty development.
- 4.3.2 Promises further communications to ensure faculty have the resources needed to excel in their roles, invites engagement
