Course & Instructor Policies

Map Quizzes: There will be a map quiz almost every week that will consist of the region of the week. Students are expected to first study and memorize each regional geographic area of countries before taking the quiz. The quizzes will consist of short answers and/or multiple choice worth 6% total of the semester grade.

Exams: There will be a Midterm and Final exam consisting of multiple choice and/or short answers. Both are worth 20% of the total grade and will be open notes online on Blackboard.

HW Assignments: There will be 3 HW Exercise assignments worth 4 points each. The HW should be submitted as a word doc.

Discussion Board: The Discussion Board will take place on Blackboard in essay format. Each Discussion will be worth 5 points with a total of 3 discussions for the semester due on Blackboard by 11:59pm Sunday. 3 points will be towards the Discussion essay, 750 words minimum, and at least 2 references. You can attach a word file or write directly on the discussion.

2 points are dedicated towards replying to at least 2 people. The reply must be at least 4 sentences and directly discuss something from that person's essay.

Final Project: The Final Project will be worth 27 points total. The project will be an individual itinerary project. The topic country will be chosen by the student limited to **Asia or South America**. Further instructions will follow on Blackboard under Syllabus & Docs. 2 points will be dedicated to Final Project Step 1 & 2, which will be assigned early in the semester.

Late Assignments: Late Assignments are strictly NOT accepted unless there is **prior** approval. Please see announcements and class schedule for detailed due dates. Any assignment turned in after the due date will result in an automatic 0.
