- Locates, identifies and monitors larval mosquito habitat
- Maintains and inventories assigned equipment
- Organizes trap equipment daily and safely transports equipment to trap sites
- Utilizes and enters data into a comprehensive database
- Conducts site visits relating to mosquito and forest pest inquiries
- Educates the general public through a variety of outreach/education adult and child activities
- Performs other duties as assigned

- Must have a valid driver's license with a clean driving record
- Must possess a High School Diploma or equivalent (GED)
- Must be able to communicate effectively in English
