ABSTRACT

The study examines the relationship between economic and non-economic (social and environmental) pillars of sustainable development (SD) within the USA. SD is examined at subnational scales – across all states and localities – using the first 16 Sustainable Development Goals categorized into three pillars of SD. Geographically, the Southern states and localities scored poorly on SDGI, and high performers are clustered in the Northeastern region. While a bi-directional positive relationship was observed between economic and social, a negative relationship appeared between economic and environmental pillars. The influence of various economic aspects on social and the feedback effects of the same varied geographically at the locality scale. It provides crucial information for planning policy implications.
