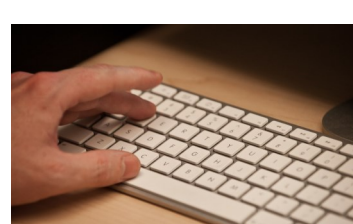
Video Contest
